

Project plans.....

The Montana Department of transportation has hired Knife River Corporation, the same contractor that completed the Main Street in Bozeman two years ago, to do what they call a mill and fill on the entire stretch of Park Street in Livingston. A mill and fill does not involve as much time or disruption as a full scale pavement project. You will see it progress quite quickly. They will also install new curb and gutter and some new sidewalks on the South side of Park Street. The city is purchasing new "antique looking street lights". This project will have a major impact on the beautification of our city. MDOT has A future project planned to install a stop light at the Y intersection near North 7th Street and create a safer intersection there. Next year MDOT has plans to replace the bridge over the Yellowstone River which will include a pedestrian walking area. We appreciate the Montana Department of Highways for choosing us for this update.

Hello you will soon see Knife River's construction crew rolling into town. They are the contractor that has been chosen to complete the Montana Department of Transportation's "mill & fill" project on Park Street. As you are probably already aware, Park Street is a highway and not a City of Livingston street. This project is a great opportunity for our city to get a new street, curbs, gutters, some new sidewalks and new street lights. This project will start on West Park Street by the interchange and finish East of town by the East highway

interchange. Our city was chosen for this worthwhile project above many other areas. Even though there may be a few frustrations the end result will be a brand new clean welcoming street at all entrances to our town. Frequently asked questions..

How has the city prepared for such a large

project?

When we found out that MDOT was considering doing the project we attended meetings to offer suggestions and voice our concerns, regarding access to all businesses. We will meet with the majority of the business owners that will be affected and try to alleviate their concerns about business interruption and access.

Have you heard initial complaints and/or concerns from the public?

The only complaints we have heard is about traffic congestion and confusion during our busiest time of tourist season. We have expressed these concerns to the contractor and D.O.T. , they assured us that traffic flow would be fine. They agreed to not work during the July 2-4th holiday which is a big week for our residents and visitors.

What can you tell me about business access being affected?

Knife River has assured us that there will be no interruption in business access. They said that businesses could always be accessed by foot traffic. We are in the process of working with some of the downtown business owners to alleviate parking issues.

How long will the project take?

60 working days from the start date. Solid start date is unknown but should be around May 10, 2010.



Who can help me with problems or questions?

Will there be good signage for traffic flow and parking?

The City of Livingston, businesses and Knife River will all work together to make sure that customers, visitors and residents are able to smoothly traverse our fair city.

What benefits will the community have from this project?

The benefits to our community are great... Brand new curb and gutter, some new sidewalks, filled in vaults (under sidewalks), updated, smooth, dark, pavement, traffic paint, new lighting in some areas. All in all a cleaned up beautiful welcoming entrance to our fair city!
