LIVINGSTON, MONTANA – RISK COMMUNICATION TO RESIDENTS BEHIND LEVEES

NOTICE OF ACCESS: June 3 – 14, 2024

OBJECTIVE: The Interagency Study consists of a hydraulic analysis for Yellowstone River at the City of Livingston, Montana. The analysis will evaluate flood reduction provided by the existing levee and impacts of levee overtopping and breach scenarios.

INITIAL PROJECT ACTIVITIES: Initial project activities include data collection and site reconnaissance. The United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) will be surveying multiple locations in the City of Livingston as part of an ongoing project to assess the floodplain and levee. USACE surveyors are scheduled to arrive June 4th and will be operating out of large white trucks with government license plates. The surveyors will be onsite for no more than two weeks. Locations of interest include

- Levee embankment and associated features
- Bridges over the Yellowstone River and tributaries
- 1st floor elevations of residences and commercial buildings
