- Connor will take lead on the wellness center/parks maintenance district
- Carol can take lead on tennis court resurfacing
- All hands on deck on the parks master plan improvements

- Alison & Sarah to take lead on partnering with the tree board

- Suggestions from Lisa Lowy were to focus on areas in the city so it's not a blanket 'no mow'
 - Sacajawea and Miles Park were two suggestions

We are proposing a 'no mow' May program where the city does not mow Sacajawea or Miles park and potentially other areas and encourages the public not to mow their own private yards and spaces as well. We also request \$250 for signage for the city and public spaces.
