- A1: The budget for this project is \$30,000.00.

- Q3: On Pages 20-21, the RFP is requesting the consultant to prepare "Conceptual Plans and/or case analyses" for the following parks:
 - Adventure Park, Village Green Park, Murphy's Park, Arbor Ridge Park, Seldom Seen Parks, Library Park Improvements.

- A3: The Parks should be amended as Katie Bonnell Park, Miles Park, Sacajawea Park, Mayors Landing Dog Park, Reservoir Park, Green Acres Park, Myers View Park, Mike Webb Park, Water Plant Park, Jack Weimer Memorial Park, Highground Public Use, Bozeman Park, North Side Soccer Park, Mars Park, and Riverside Park.
- Q4: Please describe the deliverable you envision from the "conceptual plan" or "case analysis"?
- A4: We are dedicated to developing a Parks Master Plan that serves as a dynamic, living document, meticulously outlining our approach to enhancing and maintaining our parks and trail system.
