




I would like to begin by sending a HUGE THANK YOU to our Recreation Coordinators with the City of Livingston Recreation Department. Without them we would not have been able to successfully offer the facility rental space and variety of activities to the public this fall. Rikki Earle has worked for the Recreation Department for close to 3 years – and is a familiar face to you at the City Pool as the Pool Manager. Andy Ballinger joined our team this fall – probably during the toughest year and has taken to the job in stride. Andy is focusing on our Sports/Outdoor Recreation offerings while Rikki focuses on Early Childhood, Youth & Teen Programming, and Special Events AND oversees our younger staff members.

We are thankful for our partnership with the Park High School Ranger Football program and want to give a shout out to Kevin Harrington, with Livingston Fire & Rescue and the Ranger football players for refereeing the games.

We introduced the First Tee Community Youth Golf Program to over 25 participants ranging from Kindergarten to 6th grade. This program was held indoors with gym safe materials provided by AMB West Foundation and Arthur Blank. We will continue to offer this program throughout the year in case you missed your opportunity – it was great fun and highly educational!

Our Adult Volleyball League had 6 teams – even during the pandemic. Teams were understanding of the modifications we made due to COVID and we even saw a champion among the rest, CONGRATULATIONS to the Deen team for their end of season victory!

The success and joy of our Adult Volleyball League paired with a new full-time staff member led to the introduction of our first-ever Youth Volleyball Skills Camp. This activity served 14 excited youth, ages 9-12 years and was coached by none other than PHS Head Volleyball Coach Brenda Speake and other wonderful volunteers. I don't think this will be the last of our skill development camps – stay tuned for more!

In addition to the sports world we have been busy training youth ages 11-14 as certified Safe Sitters. These students participate in 8 hours of curriculum and receive their Safe Sitter Completion Certificate, as well as plenty of information to become great babysitters. They are ready and excited to help you and your family!

Holiday Events were most difficult to accommodate the past 6 months – with that said, I am proud of what we have accomplished. Virtual is the name of the game and we had fun distributing everything from filled Easter Eggs for your very own Egg Hunt last spring to "Booing" your Neighbor/Friend during October. We had a spooky array of participation in our Halloween Home Decorating Contest and we are at it again with our "Light Up Livingston" Holiday Lights Map. Livingston StoryWalk ®


We are thrilled to partner with the Livingston-Park County Public Library and the Livingston Business Improvement

All participating children can get a free hot chocolate from Coffee


