



Reserve a Park Gazebo or Shelter

Four shelters in the city park system are available to reserve from April 1-October 31.

Gazebos & Shelters are available to reserve through Livingston Parks & Recreation, when not reserved they are available to the general public on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Others must yield the use of a pavilion to groups holding a permit issued by the City of Livingston.

November 1 - March 31 facilities are available first come, first served.
